Goal of MRSAP

- Goal of MRSAP project is to build stronger community support systems so people can return to their home communities from the state hospital and remain in their home communities pursuing their hopes and dreams
- Who benefits?
 - Consumer, families, county citizens, hospital and community staff....and many more

What has happened so far?

- As of July 31, 2006, 30 people discharged from Mayview State Hospital and one unit was closed
- \$3.2 million was allocated to five counties for service development for those individuals who were discharged and for individuals to help them remain in the community
- Now in Phase 2 and seven additional people discharged with a goal of 30 individuals discharged by June 30, 2007 and funding to follow

Other happenings.....

- Increase peer mentor activities
- Improve CSP Process
- Establish Quality Improvement and Outcomes Committee

Quality Improvement and Outcomes Committee

- Committee is charged with developing a quality improvement plan to monitor the progress of the project and, most importantly, in the community
- More than half members are consumers and family members
- Other members are Disability Rights Network, DPW, managed care companies, counties and Mayview representatives

How do we know how folks are doing?

- Counties have implemented a process to ensure that Community Support Plans are being followed and to know the status of people who were discharged
- This process has an “early warning” system to help people get needs met if they begin to encounter difficulties and help them remain in the community

Where are the folks from?

- Of the 30 people discharged in Phase 1
 - 22 currently live in Allegheny;
 - 4 live in Beaver;
 - 3 live in Washington;
 - 1 lives in Lawrence

How are people doing? (34 people discharged so far)

- 52% use blended case management
- 29% use Community Treatment Team services (*will continue to increase*)
- 12% use intensive case management services
- 6% use resource coordination or administrative case management

Where are they living?

- 29% live in long term structured residential programs
- 21% live in supportive housing
- 18% live in enhanced personal care homes
- 6% live with their family
- 6% live in community residential rehabilitation facilities
- Other seven live in a variety of settings

What are they doing?

- 26% participating in rehabilitation activities which include a variety of things
- 44% are engaging in hobbies they enjoy
- As people are more settled, we expect to see this increase

Who is in their support systems?

- 82% have support from family members
- 15% are visiting drop-in centers
- 12% are spending time with friends
- 6% have peer to peer support

Are they satisfied and happy?
